MMKC University Junior Program

The Junior Program at MMKC University is a 2-day course with the intermediate machine knitter in mind. This program pre-requisite is attendance of the Freshman and Sophomore Programs or understanding of techniques offered in those programs (see curricula for the Freshman and Sophomore Programs on the MMKC website under Education). Instructors will not teach basic techniques from prior MMKC University Programs.

MMKC does not sell or repair knitting machines. The MMKC website, http://www.midwestmachineknitters.org/ has listings of dealers within and outside the state of Minnesota as well as links to other sources for machine knitting for repairs, parts, etc.

In order to have an accurate pattern, please email the size you plan to knit – between sizes 32 to 48 (finished sizes 34 to 50) and your machine gauge (standard, mid-gauge, bulky) to mmkc.mn@gmail.com at least 1 week prior to the class.
